

Who hasn't heard of Winnie-the-Pooh and Christopher Robin? Did you read the popular A.A. Milne stories as a child or maybe you read them to your children or grand children? This book is a gem of background information behind the stories of Winnie-the-Pooh and his friends. I found that having

these tidbits of information gave more meaning and depth to Christopher Robin, the real boy, who played with his imaginary friends. We learn about the man, A.A. Milne and the illustrator E.H.
