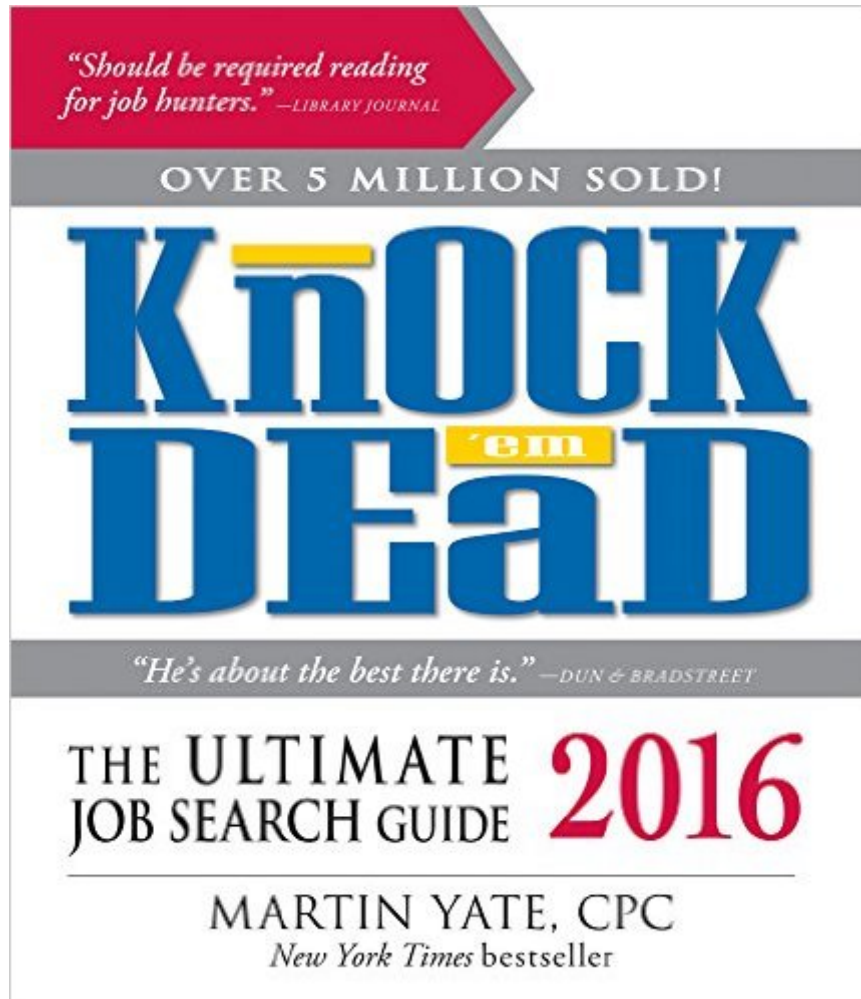

I do believe the best advice the author offers is that following up - the "traditional way" is vital. Sadly, we now need an "online brand" and presence to appear at the forefront of technology. I've contended for years that LinkedIn hasn't eliminated cold calling, it has only made it more effective than ever! Cold calling is the way to get through the "noise." It used to be that an email marketing message was the way to get someone's attention. So, that is my marketing prediction for the future - social media has gotten so out of control that we'll be forced to return to our primitive means for doing business, and dare I say communicating in general! It's a great thing but has become out of control. Thanks to the author for a great book - I just need a lot of time that I don't have right now to navigate through it.
