

I'm using this textbook for a class currently, and so far I like it content-wise. However, if you order the Kindle version, you need to realize that this is basically just a straight digital copy of the book. The text cannot be resized and reflowed like it would with a normal eBook, and you are stuck with big margins eating up your screen space unless you manually zoom on each page. In addition, many of the graphics, sidebar notes, and what one of my teachers used to refer to as "Gee Whiz" info boxes tend to break up the text, and you will find yourself panning around and flipping pages back and forth as a result. So, I'm knocking it down a star due to the lazy conversion. I have seen eBooks that were simpler and allowed text formatting customization, and I've also seen eBooks that

were more complicated, but designed to better take advantage of the interactive format of the tablet, with scroll-able subsections or internal shortcuts to hop back and forth to different sections. If the publishers want to really take advantage of the eBook format, they'll be able to produce some quality products.

This book is what you would expect. It helps the people like myself who have worked in the industry for a long time but never went to school. Further, it does have information that people who do not know anything, will need to survive. To buy this book in order to read, I would say not to do that. If this is a requirement for school and you don't know IT or MIS, then you must buy it.

As an instructor, I selected and used this book for the capstone course in an undergraduate Business Information Systems degree. Our goal was to look at the profession as a whole and

understand all the moving parts in an enterprise: technologies, ethical and legal challenges, and the related financial and human issues. This book is a great platform for the conversation, and is one I will use again in the future. My students found it was well organized, written with a conversational voice with just enough detail to be interesting and helpful. One of the best features of the book are the case studies, which help the student understand the topic in a practical way but also provides inspiration for deeper research.
