

This story was interesting for the most part, I found it to be a bit predictable at times but I find that in a lot of contemporary stories so it didn't really bother me. I read contemporary stories for the journey the characters take, and I generally enjoy ones that involve love and soul searching in high school - and this book had that. I've read some reviews where people wanted more parental presence, or how it didn't seem real that this was a normal high school experience - but I completely related to all of it.
