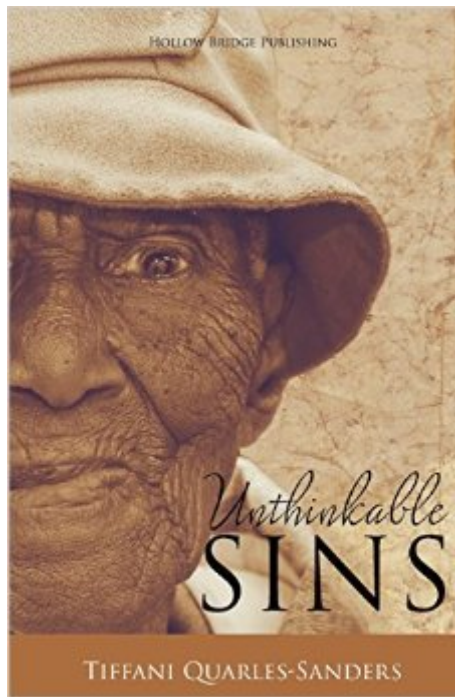


The book was found

Jerome does not know if his mother's confessional is driven by guilt or revenge, or just an unfortunate random consequence of her illness, but he's not sure he can wait to find out. His career is at stake if she tells anyone how his own past mistakes are entwined with hers. Neither he nor his wife is about to let that happen.

This novel follows the twists and turns of an old woman's deteriorating mind, so it definitely

requires some keeping up. This is an entertaining family drama set in the black community, and the main character, is a study in how racism, sexism, misperceptions and family problems can affect a person's behavior and self esteem. Her experiences make for a thought-provoking, emotional read, and just like in real life, things don't necessarily end up with the way you might expect them to. This book is a great stand-alone story, but the pieces are definitely in place for an interesting sequel if this author decides to go that route.
